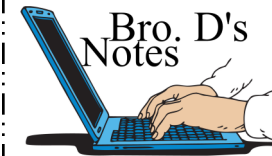

There are many voices vying for our attention these days. We need to be very careful to whom we give our attention. What sounds good may end up being the wrong voice. Take for example the voice of self-help guru James Arthur Ray. He claimed to others that if they would follow his philosophy and principles they would "double, triple, even multiply by ten the size of your business." His promises were about being healthy and wealthy spiritually and financially. He invited fifty clients to his sweat lodge in Sedona, Arizona.

Ray was offering financial advice to these fifty clients in Sedona. All fifty crowded into his 415-square-foot sweat lodge. These people were on a five-day spiritual retreat that cost them between nine and ten thousand dollars. Part of the program included a thirty-six hour fast before they came to enhance their personal spiritual experience. Before entering the sweat lodge, they had eaten from a breakfast buffet. Because of the temperature inside the sweat lodge, and the overcrowding of more than fifty people things went bad. Many started passing out and vomiting. In spite of this, they were encouraged to stick it out. Some two hours later, three of them were dead.

These people did not listen to the right voice. The right voice is the voice of Jesus Christ. On the Mount of Transfiguration, when the dust had settled and Elijah and Moses had departed, the disciples heard the voice of the Father make this assertion about Jesus: "This is My beloved Son, LISTEN TO HIM!!!" That is the voice to which we need to listen.

Satan even tried to tempt Jesus, the Son of God, in the wilderness. However, Satan's distractions did not work, and we need to take note of how Jesus responded to those temptations. Rather than listen to the voice of His enemy, Jesus turned to the holy Scriptures. Jesus listened to the voice of His Father and it delivered Him from Satan's temptations.

During this Thanksgiving holiday, let us be thankful that as believers we can hear the voice of Jesus. Let us pray we will pay close attention to His voice. His voice leads us to life!
